

## USGS 13119000, Little Lost River near Howe, Idaho

### Location

About 7 miles northwest of Howe on Bureau of Land Management land in Butte County.

### Period of Record

April 1921 to September 1981, April 1985 to September 1990 (no winter records prior to October 1940), April 2014 to present.

### Extremes for Period of Record

- Maximum discharge: about 450 cubic feet per second, recorded August 11, 1936, during cloudburst.
- Minimum discharge observed before construction of bypass: 4.1 cubic feet per second, recorded December 12, 1940.
